

Application Process, Accessibility, and Non-Discrimination Policy

Once the applicant has submitted a complete application, the process will take anywhere from 2 days to 2 weeks, depending on how quickly we can obtain third-party information, including but not limited to your Rental History.

- Anyone over the age of 18 years is required to fill out their own application.
- \$50.00 fee per application.
- Copy of Photo Identification required.
- Copy of ALL sources of Income required.
- If you have animals, you must provide vet records that include the age, type, breed, weight, and up-to-date vaccination records of the animal.

Qualifying Factors:

- Income
- Credit Report
- Criminal/Violent/Sexual Offender History
- Rental History References/Homeownership
- Personal References
